What do you need to know about building a wine cellar?

Building a wine cellar isn't just a luxury — it can also be a significant value-add for your home later on. But, there are a couple of things you'll need to keep in mind when building a wine cellar. From the space to the location to the materials, make sure to dot your I's and cross your T's for the best addition. Here are some key things to keep in mind:

- First off: do you have enough room? Your wine cellar doesn't need to be huge, but you'll also want enough space to justify the cellar.
- Are you prepared for the financial investment? (A wine cellar usually needs an additional cooling system for max efficiency.)

- Do you have an optimal wine cellar space? You'll want to look for an area close to an exterior wall and one that will stay dark.
- What type of wine cellar are you wanting? You can build one that's super functional, or you can create a space more so meant to show off your collection.

Once you've decided on your optimal location, budget, and wine cellar design, you can get going on the nitty-gritty behind the wine cellar build.

Here's your wine cellar checklist:

- A cool area within your home (preferably hugging an exterior wall) for the cellar.
- A cooling system that brings your cellar to an optimal, consistent temperature and humidity between 10 and 18 degrees celsius.
- A sealed and insulated enclosure with enough space to store the desired amount of wine.
- Rot-resistant hardwoods and composite materials.
- Wine racking (that will resist vibrations).
- An airtight door to maintain humidity and temperature.

PRO TIP:

An airtight seal is key to a wine cellar that works like it should, so add in weather-stripping for a double-strong enclosure.

What's the project timeline?

While adding in a wine cellar can make a massive difference in your home, it'll also take a minimal time investment compared to many home additions. You'll want to take your time, though; a rushed wine cellar won't ever be as great as one built with more intention. Wine cellars with more extensive racking and construction will take more time to build, while a smaller, more showy wine cellar can easily be a weekend project. It depends: what are your aims, and how much time do you have?

When adding on a more luxurious wine cellar, you're looking at a project timeline of around a week with a professional build.



Adding in the extra little touches

While building a wine cellar is a little luxury in itself, you can also build in special additions into your wine cellar. Here are some Gilbert + Burke favourites:

- Customized wine racking: Choose shelving for your wine in your favourite material, whether it's a mahogany finish or a backlit gallery.
- Wall detail: By adding crown moulding or a shiny trim, you can add a new level of depth to your wine cellar.

- You'll want to design the room with intention. The right theatre room has great sound, but also great viewing. The best theatre rooms usually have dark walls, an excellent screen and comfy seats (or loungers)!
- What type of theatre room are you wanting? You can build one that's super cinemaic, or you can create a more relaxed vibe geared towards lounging around while you watch.

Once you've decided on your space, goals and theatre room design, you can get going on the details of your theatre room build.

Here's your theatre room checklist:

- A dedicated space within your home, away from sound and (preferably) window-free.
- Seating, whether you're

 looking for a movie theatre,
 cinema-style seats or lounger
 bean bags and couches.
 Remember to place the
 seating far back from the screen
 to ensure the best viewing, and
 keep in mind that theatre-style
 seats will require risers to ensure
 that everyone can see.
- A screen or projector that gives you a crisp, clear picture, as well as an immersive surround sound system that offers you the theatre experience you're looking for. You'll want to bring in an A/V specialist will need to be brought in for this step.

- A soundproofed room that keeps external sound out and internal sound in, whether you choose a location like the basement or adding additional soundproofing with sound installation behind the drywall.
- A lighting system to give your theatre room depth and luxury, as well as a more cinematic feel. You can consider everything from recessed lighting to dimmers to up your experience with a bigger theatrical vibe.
- An A/V component rack that keeps all of your theatre gear in one proper, well-ventilated spot with custom cabinetry to hide it.



PRO TIP:

Wall-to-wall carpet might not (usually) be our recommendation, but it's great for theatre rooms. The carpet can help absorb light AND sound for a more immersive home viewing setup.

What's the project timeline?

Adding in a theatre room to your home is something you'll want to take some extra time since attention to detail makes a big difference. Your project timeline will differ depending on a few things: are you renovating an existing room or basement or building one on to your home? Do you need to add risers? Each little detail adds time to the project calendar, but each little detail is worth it.

Adding in the extra little touches

While building a theatre room is a little luxury in itself, there are also tons of special additions you can build and add in to supplement your theatre room addition. Here are some Gilbert + Burke favourites:
